THAT Sphere:

Stratford's Las Vegas Sphere replica is a hot topic in real estate, blending into mainstream discussions. London's Mayor initially rejected it, citing local residents' concerns. However, Michael Gove has called for a public enquiry, potentially overturning this decision. This situation presents an excellent example to demonstrate a nuanced understanding of real estate developments.

London Office Trends:

Despite the trend towards hybrid working and reduced office space usage, as seen with HSBC leaving Canary Wharf, the London office market is witnessing a record year in new starts and renovations. This scenario illustrates the need for a balanced perspective in real estate discussions, recognizing opportunities in market shifts and addressing the challenge of building obsolescence.



The Flex Space:

The WeWork saga has revealed surprising resilience in the UK flex space market, contrasting with its US counterpart. The UK market's diversity and fragmentation has meant WeWork's limited market share limited the damage it could have cause to mostly reputational.

At its peak, WeWork took up 4% of the flex market in the UK, and since its fall, flex uptake continues to grow, suggesting a robust demand for flexible office spaces. This resilience points to ongoing opportunities in the sector, especially now, the redistribution of WeWork's portfolio is expected to generate swift interest from landlords for flexible office operators, underscoring the market's dynamism.



Trends to watch

Commercial Catch Up; Residential Reverse Highest level of new office builds/ renovations in London since 2005. November sees 'cold postcodes' increase by 846% from 2021.

New Highs for Super-Prime

Office Rents West End rents have exceeded £175/sqft this year and look like they could hit £300/sqft by Dec 2024.
